MEDICAL MAJOR CODES. 1. American Medical Association Code of Ethics (1846). The code contains 9 articles stressing responsibility of doctors. 2. Declaration of Geneva (1948 – rev. 2002). This oath for physicians is largely in response to atrocities during WWII. 3. Declaration of Helsinki (Adopted 1964; latest amendment 2000). The code can be describe by: “the well-being of the human subject should take precedence over the interest of science and society”. 4. Nuremburg Code (1947). 5. Oath of Maimonides and the Daily Prayer of a Physician. 6. Thomas Percival. Medical Ethics (1803). “The code asserted the moral authority and independence of physicians in service of others. Affirmed the profession’s responsibility to care for the sick, and emphasize the most important principles of medical ethics”. 7. World Medical Association International Code (1949). “This was an attempt to professional associations and governmental bodies, other organizations such as the Catholic Church have issued codes concerning matters of human health”.
