## **FYI: Weather Forcast Education**

Weather forecasting is difficult, however improving as technology advances. Weather forecast can be based on Astronomy as stated in the 2017 issue of the Farmer's Market. Here is the remaining forecast for March and the first 15 days of April in weather zone 5 (Southern Central States). March: 8-11 - Showery Texas/Louisiana Coast; generally fair elsewhere; 12-15 - Fair skies' gusty winds; 16-19 - Stormy weather sweeps across much of the region; 20-23 - Fair skies, cold; 24-27 - Light rain, especially over Texas; 28-31 - Showery New Mexico, Texas; heavy thunderstorms Oklahoma. April: 1-3 - Unsettled conditions evolve; 4-7 - Clouds linger northern New Mexico, Texas Panhandle, Oklahoma; 8-11 - Thunderstorms; 12 -15 - Showers still along Texas/Louisiana Coasts; fair/pleasant elsewhere.
