Topic: Youth Protection Guidelines Education: Every Kiwanis club is expected to educate its members on the Kiwanis Youth Protection Guidelines. Each year, a club should provide members with a copy of the Guidelines with educational training—informing them of the **highest standards of conduct** and awareness. Kiwanis chaperones must be at least 21 years of age, and must be able to have a clear criminal background check. Over night stays must have 1 adult for every 10 youth for male and female. When transporting youth always follow the rule of 3, at least 2 adults for 1 youth. No alcohol, tobacco or other substances are permitted around youth. Written permission must be obtained from the parents if a student needs to take medication. Kiwanis members must report troubling behavior or suspected abuse to the proper authorities. Personal information about youth members must be kept confidential and kept for 3 years then destroyed. Do not initiate contact with a youth on social media. It must come from the youth member and keep your contact to a minimum. Have parental permission to post photographs and information on public media. Follow school policies and rules or local and national laws and regulations when dealing with youth. “Columbus Day is no more in the corridors of City Hall. The Austin City Council on Thursday voted to replace the holiday with *Indigenous Peoples Day*, a holiday that celebrates Native Americans. Columbus Day is a federal holiday, so it has not been eradicated, but Interim City Manager Elaine Hart did say city calendar will no longer refer to the holiday named for Christopher Columbus. Austin follows other U.S. Cities – including Seattle, Denver, Albuquerque, N.M. – in renaming the holiday observed on the second Monday of October”. *SOURCE: Austin American-Statesman, 6 October 2017.*
