Topic: Stormwater Pollution Prevention Tips: *Use fertilizer sparingly and sweep off driveways, sidewalks and curb back on to the lawn so it won't get washed into the drains *Vegetate bare spots in your yard, Take your car to the carwash instead of washing in your driveway* Pick up after your pet, do not leave pet waste in the grass or in the street * Recycle your motor oil, and check your vehicle for fluid leaks * Consider using a rain barrel and reusing rain water * Throw your trash in the garbage, not on the ground. Following these simple procedures will help keep your drinking water clean. Almost everything that gets left on the ground eventually will make its way to your source of drinking water. Never put fats, oils and grease in your drain. Over time, grease can harden in your pipes, causing them to clog. There is a grease recycling receptacle at the Transfer Station on FM 2410. Also flushable wipes are becoming an issue as they do not break down and dissolve once in the sanitary sewer system. Please put those in the trash.
