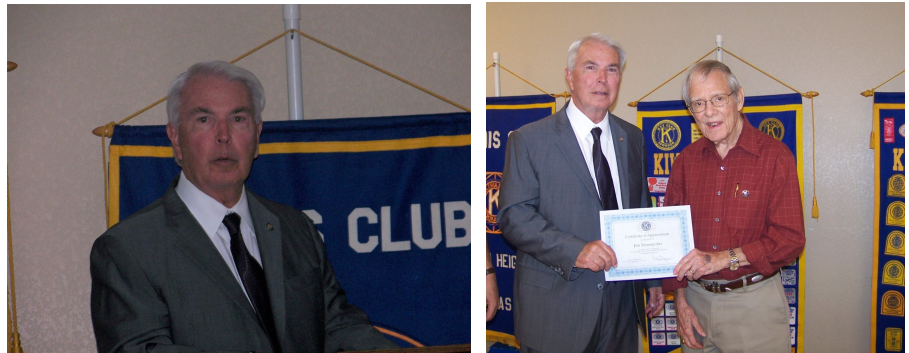

Harker Heights Kiwanis Club Meeting 11-05-19

Speaker: Jim Yeonopolus, Chancellor
Topic: Central Texas College - Central Texas College was established by the citizens of Central Texas in 1965 to serve the western section of Bell County, Texas. The campus was constructed on more than 500 acres of land donated by Fort Hood between Killeen and Copperas Cove. In September 1967, the school opened its doors to 2,068 students. CTC has been accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools since 1969. As defined by the Texas Legislature, the official service area of CTC comprises: All of Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Llano, Mason, Mills, and San Saba Counties. Due to its proximity to the US Army installation at Fort Hood, Central Texas College has evolved from a small junior college into a community college catering to the military. CTC instituted classes and programs on Fort Hood in 1970 and in Europe in 1974. CTC offered classes for the Texas Department of Criminal Justice in the prisons at Gatesville, Texas, in 1976. The military recently changed their tuition assistance to the service members so many of the campuses CTC had around the world has had to close or greatly reduced. One thing they are very proud of is the dual credit college/high school programs and the Early College Program they have where the student can earn their associates degree or their occupational certification by the time they graduate from high school. Many are ready for the workforce, or their credits can transfer directly to Texas A & M CT if seeking a bachelors and masters degrees. For more information visit: www.ctcd.edu
